in Virginia being much Improv'd in body but of a sound and perfect
Mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory
Life do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner
following Viz: I bequeath my last will and estate whosoever and whithersoever I bequeath
to be buried in a Christian Decent Manner, and as touching
such worldly Estate as is left I leave God to dispose of the same
of the same in the following manner Viz: I bequeath I give and
bequeath unto Elmer Hutchison wife to George Hutchison my dear
Mear and her both Item I give and bequeath unto John Douglas my
son my House Mear and thirty years of Ten hundred and one yard
wide Item I give and bequeath unto Alexander Douglas my son
my black mare and her both and my grey Horse with two other black
of which also I bequeath unto four hundred of my land and plantation
on the north side of James River the other two hundred of said land
to the above named John Douglas during his

I give and bequeath unto the above named John Douglass
lifetime and then it shall become the above named Alexander Douglass
lastly I give and bequeath unto George Hutchinson Eighteen Pounds
four Shillings and Eight pence Pennsylvania Currency which is
Owing to me out of which I allow my self to be decently buried my debts
said and Five Pounds five Shillings thereof to be given to the above
named John Douglass and the remainder (excepting one Pound which
said George Hutchinson is to have / the said George is to divide between his
Owen wife and the said Alexander Douglass who the said Alexander Douglass
and said George Hutchinson appears and make full and sole Executors
of this last will and Testament, Revoking Disannulling and
making void all former wills and Last Wishes by me made and
Declaring this Only to be my last will and Testament In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first
above written

At a Court held for Orange County the 28th day of February 1744
Thomas Chaw Gent in Court by Alexander Douglas one of the Justices there
Assisted sworn by the Justice Felix Connaday and Andrew Thos Gent the Just of the
County who also depose that they saw James Hare Sign the Inveinment
and Oath to be recorded in the motion of the said Edrd Johnson Oak
According to Law Court further granted him for obtaining Letters of Probate
thereof in due form giving Security on which he with Felix Connaday Andrew
Woodward James Patton Gent his Securities Entered into and Acknowledged
their bond according to Law

Felix Connaday Andrew Thos and James Patton Gent are held and firmly
bound unto Thomas Chaw Gent the Just in the Commission of the Peace
for Orange for and in behalf and so the sole Use and behoof of the Justice
of the said County and their Successors in the Sum of five hundred pounds
Sterling to be paid to the said Thomas Chaw his Executors Administrators
and Assigns to the which Payment well and and truly to be made we bind our
Selves and Every of us our and Every of our heirs Executors and Assigns
Severally firmly by these Presents Sealed with our Seals dated this Twenty Eighth
