I Then I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved Daughter Betty
One Negro man named George.

I Then I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter Anne
one Negro boy named Jack, and if any Misfortune should happen
to either of the Two Negroes so that they or either of them should
Die before either of the Children come of Age that it should be made

up to her with Legally the same out of the Income of the negroes.

When Left to my wife, and as for my miserable Estate I Give unto my
Wife until the Two Children come of Age and then to be equally

Divided between her and the Two Children. And I Constitute my
Wife Margaret my Executor, and my Father John Lambing, and James Lambing

My fellow named John Jack and one Negro Man named Maria
I Tom I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Daughter Betty
One Negro man named George

I Tom I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Daughter Maria
one Negro boy named Jack, and if any Misfortune should happen
to either of the Two Negroes so that they or either of them should
Die before either of the Children come of Age that it should be made
up to her who I give the same out of the Income of the Virginia
that I give to my wife, and as for any movable Estate I have unto my
wife until the Two Children come of Age and then to be equally
Divided between her and the Two Children. And I Legatize my
wife Margaret Lambey, and my Father John Lambey, and James Lambey
as Executors and Administors of my Estate and all Benefactors of this
my last will and Testament all singulars my Estate by them
