Form and manner following first and Principally I bequeath
My soul to Almighty God who gave it hoping through the merit
of Jesus Christ to be raised up at the Last day and my Body
to be Entred at the Discretion of Executors hereafter named

I bequeath

My desire is that my just debts & personall Expenses be paid
I give and bequeath unto my son John Hachins Two Books
and Calves to be possessed of wherever he leaves of Overseas
and goes to house keeping

I give I lend to my Beloved wife Elizabeth Hachins all the residue
of my Estate both real and personall During her natural
Life and after her decease to be divided as follows

Viz I give unto my son William Hachins twenty Shillings
so long as he should be living at the time of my decease and
Dead to decide to my son John Hachins Twenty Shillings

I give unto my son Benjamin Hachins Twenty Shillings

I give unto my son John Hawthens all the rest of my estate
to be immediately possessed of after the death of my wife
Elizabeth Hawthens to him and his heirs forever

I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Hawthens
executrix and my son John Hawthens executor of this my last
Will and testament revoking all Wills heretofore by me made
testifying and confirming this to be my only will and test-
ment In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 20th Day of January Anno Domini 1776

This last Will & Testament of William Hawthens Dec. was
produced into Court by Elizabeth Hawthens and John Hawthens
executors there named, and proved by the oaths of William
Stedman & Thomas Bacon, two of the Justices of the Peace

And ordered to be recorded and in the nature of the said last
Who made oath according to law to certify is granted them therefore
They with William G. brother, their Security acknowledged them to be
To the same in the sum of Three hundred pounds
