Constitute and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following first I commend
my soul to God that gave it and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the Direction of my
Ex^{or}. hereinafter named hoping through the Merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to be saved again
and become partaker of the never failing joys of Immortality and at last reaching my most Beloved State
where with it hath pleased God to bless me with my dear Wife of our bequeath in Manner and
form following first my Will and Desire is that all my Debts be paid Then I give and
Bequeath unto my beloved friend Joseph Hawkins one certain tract or parcel of Land containing
by Estimation two Hundred and fifty Acres lying on the lower side of the River and bounding one Part
granted to Samuel Smith to him and his heirs or assigns forever, I then I give and bequeath unto
my eldest son Joseph Pollard one tract of Land which I purchased of Anthony Gholson
containing one Hundred and twenty Acres I then my will and Desire is that all the rest of
my Estate both Real and personal be Equally divided among the rest of my Children viz^t
Sarah Pollard William Pollard and one yet not born for then my will and Desire is that
my beloved wife Elizabeth Pollard shall and may enjoy all my Estate both Real and personal
Excepting that Tract of Land given to Joseph Hawkins) During the time of her Widowhood
but if she should alter her State of life by marriage then my will and Desire is that she shall

and may enjoy only one third part of that Tract of Land given to my son Joseph which third part
she may enjoy during her life and if my wife should Marry then my Will and Desire is that
my Children should pay their parts portions or shares when they shall come to age and lastly
I do appoint my well beloved wife Eliza Pollard my Executrix of this my last will &
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Thirteenth Day of July
A.D. 1706 one Thousand Seven Hundred and forty Six
