to the respective intents of each as will more fully appear by the two papers one marked A and the other B which is here with submitted as forming a part of this report - We then proceeded to ascertain the advancements made by the defendant in his life time to the Defendants Henry G. Ballaway and Wm Ballaway and found that Henry G. Ballaway had received in cash and property to the amount of £ 12 6<sup>7</sup> and William Ballaway the sum of £ 1190 in cash and property and the parties all wishing it the four tracts of land that we then proceeded to divide were allotted to Samuel Ballard Ralph Ballard James Ballard and Booker as follows the two ballaways agreeing to let the lands go off their advancements as far as they would <sup>go and have received at Cash</sup> price to put them on an equal footing with the said Henry G.
