Second I lend to my daughter Sarah Davis one half of the residue of my property both real and personal of whatever nature or kind it may be during her natural life, and at the death of my daughter the property I lend her the same I will to be equally divided between her and her heirs forever.

Third The balance of my property that is not otherwise disposed of I lend to my daughter Susan Ferguson during her natural life and at her death that is my daughter Susan. It is my will and desire the property I lend her shall be equally divided between the heirs of her body, to have and to hold forever.

of September 1837
