 of the County Court of Sullivan County made the 18th day of June 1849
 in which John Shaw, Timothy Shaw, Nancy Shaw and Wilmoth Shaw
 are appellants and Edmund State and Elizabeth his wife and
 Joseph M Yeatts are appellees, was ordered to be recorded as the true last will
 and Testament of the said Samuel Gay died.

And at another day to wit. At a Circuit Superior Court of law and Chancery continued and held

penalty of five thousand dollars Conditioned according to law, Certificate was granted
him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
