

I Samuel Laprad of Pittsylvania County and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say—

1st I give to my wife Jane Laprad all of my land for and during the term of her natural life, and after her decease I give the same to my two sons Alexander Laprad and Joseph Laprad to be equally divided between them, also I give to my wife Jane Laprad one Cow and calf and one ewe and two Lambs also three other sheep, one feather bed and necessary bedding furniture for the same & bedstead—

2^d I give to my son Alexander Laprad one bed, bedstead and furniture, all my Carpers tools, all my turning tools and Carpenters Tools—

3^d I give to my sons Joseph Laprad and Alexander Laprad all of my Plantation tools, also each of them one hufier affixer, also one wheel for between them, together with all my longhairs, also one wooden clock, also I give to my son Joseph Laprad one black colt—

4th I give to my daughter Frances Laperad one heifer
5th I give to my daughter Nancy Laperad one heifer
6th I give to my wife Jane Laperad the balance of my property
not herein before particularly disposed of for and dur-
ing the term of her natural life and after her decease
to be sold and the proceeds equally divided between my
children namely Andrew Laperad, John Laperad and
the heirs of Benjamin Laperad, to-wit: William W. Laperad
and James Laperad and William Laperad, and my
daughter Catharine Fink.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
son Alexander Laperad Executor of this my last will
and Testament hereby revoking all other or former
wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.

At a circuit court continued and held for the County of Pennsylvania at the Court House thereof on the 28th day of May 1852.

This last Will and Testament of Samuel Laperad Dec^d. was presented in court and proven by the oaths of three subscribing witnesses and ordered to be recorded - And the executor nominated in the will refusing to qualify, on the motion of Joseph J. C. Laperad who made oath ^{with} Joab Oakes and Joab Watson his securities and sureties (who justified as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand five hundred dollars conditioned according to law Certificate was granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said decedent with his said will annexed in due
