Crump, also the slaves which I at present possess, Toke
Ned, Sally Henry, Daniel Dick and Peter to him and
his heirs forever. And I do hereby request the favour of
my friends Henry Lawson Pierce and Benjamin Walcher
to execute this my last will and Testament. In testimony
whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name, and affixed
my seal this twenty seventh day of January in the year
one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven.

I also gave unto the said Joseph Crump all my furniture
 of every kind, & my library with my debts and fees of
 Office exclusive of One hundred dollars which I bequeath
 to Joseph Royal Boukey son of William Bentley as a
 mark of my affection.

with the will annexed of all the goods chattels and credits of ^{deceased} ~~Richard~~ ^{James} ~~Cummins~~ ^{deceased} ~~which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the said Richard Cummins or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him; and the same so made do exhibit into the county court at such time as he shall be thereunto required by the said court; and the same goods chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law; and make a just and true account of his doings and things therein when thereunto required by the said court; and further do well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said will as far as the said goods chattels and credits will extend according to the value thereof; and as the law shall charge him; and this obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force.~~
