and Testament, in Manner and Form following. to wit.

All my land in Poughkeepsie with the Negroes and Stock of every kind
to be equally divided between My children by Ann Mearns her
Heirs and their Heirs forever. should either die under age or
lawful to me, the surviving Child or Children to possess it. the
division to be Made in the Manner directed by a Deed of
Gift of that Tract, Now of record in the County of Putnam
I give a small Tract of land in Cumberland County, lying near the
Mill of Alexander Maphin Tracts to the said Alexander Maphin
for them and their Heirs for ever.

My Executors hereafter named shall agree to buy or
redeem such a front lot in the town of Manchester in
New and other townships as they shall see fit. And
and thereupon for ever, they Executors shall also agree to buy or
a front lot in the said town of Manchester, that shall be worth just
or thereunto and upwards, and rent the said lot, which rent shall
for the support of the said Amwell Tinsley and those of her blood
that shall live with her. And at the death of the said Amwell Tinsley
Executors shall sell the said lot, and divide the money among
by the said Amwell Tinsley.

My Treasures shall also out of the sale of my land
of any other I may, pay my son Hebron One thousand for
his share, but for them be not equal to my other sons.

All the residue of my Land & Sells &c. Subject to the Payment of
Debts, and more that my Executors may ~~disposes~~ ^{disposes} of the same for
purposes, see and to these Debts that are due to me, - And after
paying all my debts, the balance to be equally divided among
my Children lawfully begotten,

I do request that Mr John Archib. Williams, Powell & my son John &
Stephen Trent, shall execute this my last Will & Testament. In W. In
