 my said wife the use of all my personal property for the support
 of her and my children namely Molly Mosely Nancy
 Mosely Elizabeth Mosely and Francis Mosely until my
 eldest Daughter should arrive to the age of twenty or there-
 abouts if it is my desire there shall be an equal division
 the negroes between my wife and said four children but in case
 of the death of either of the children before they arrive
 of twenty or thereabouts it is my desire there should be an equal
 division between the survivors each part severally to them
 and their heirs ever I further give to my Wife the free

Disposal of all my stock & every kind, as well as all my
 furniture at her death belong all my children the part of
 my Father's Estate which I am entitled to at the death of
 my Mother. I desire may be considered as a common
 with the rest of my Estate. Lastly, I constitute and
 appoint my loving wife Anna Mosely Executrix with
 Mosely my Brother and William B. Giles Executors
 to this my last will and testament hereby making all
 former wills made by me to witness whereof, I
 have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this second
 of February One Thousand Seven hundred and Ninety One
 I desire that there may be no Probation taken of any
 part of my Estate

At a Court of quarter sessions held for Powhatan County at testam
 on Thursday the 19th day of May 1791 the last will and
 testament of Benjamin Mosely was presented to Court and
 proved by the Oaths of John Chatewood Thomas Watkins
 and Benajah Watkins the Witnesses thereto and was by
 the Court ordered to be Recorded and the motion of
 Anna Mosely Executrix and William B. Giles Executors
 to have married debts made both Shuls and together with
 William Giles their Secured interest acknowledged
 their Bonds in the penalty of two thousand pounds
 conditioned as the said direct proof thereof is
 them in due form

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
