I Edmund Hannon of Powhatan county being of sound
mind and perfect memory do make and publish this my last
will and testament in manner and form following

I lend to my loving wife Agnes during the time she
continues a widow and no longer, the following land, slaves,
stock and furniture viz three hundred acres of land to
be taken from the north part of the tract on which I live
so as to include the dwelling house and the two apple
orchards, the dividing line to run straight: My slaves,
Doll and her daughter Amy, Jacob Windsor Kate and
her daughter Judy and some ^{The choice of my stock and furniture as follows} ten head of cattle, two horses
a side saddle, twenty hogs, two feather beds and furniture
one black walnut desk, one black cabinet, dining table
one pine table, twelve rush chairs, one case of bottles, sha-
ves. I likewise give to my wife Agnes forever one
hundred pounds

It is my will that the land which I own in the county
of Cumberland, any on which David Hannon now lives shall
be sold by my executors in the manner they may think
most advantageous and the money arising therefrom I do

give to my four daughters Elizabeth Goode, Mary Clarke, Martha Tye, Rebecca Toney, to be equally divided between them.

I give ^{to} my son Edmund Toney and to his heirs forever all my lands lying on the waters of deep creek, and bounded by the lines of William Mayo himself, Lipscomb Wash, John H. Chambers, James Clarke, and Daniel Mayo likewise a young negroe man named Harry and a black walnut desk.

I give to my son John ^{Toney} his heirs forever, all the land whereon I live together with all other lands which I am possessed of, and my slave Judy and all her children who are now in his possession and one black walnut calling table.

I give to my daughter Rebecca Toney forever my slave Mary and her child and her increase from this day the said slave and her child being now in ^{her} possession.

I give my still to ^{my} wife and ^{my} sons Edmund and John during the widowhood ^{of} my said wife, and do direct, that it shall remain at the place it now stands on the profit arising from it to be equally divided between them and after the expiration of my wifes widowhood I give the said still to my sons Edmund & John.

It is my will that all the remaining part of my estate, money goods & chattels be equally divided between my six children, Edmund, John, Elizabeth, Mary, Martha, and Rebecca. — I do appoint my loving wife & sons Toney, and my sons Edmund Toney and John Toney, executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of July in the year of our Lord

I give to my son ~~my son~~ ^{my} ~~John~~ ^{John} forever, all the land whereon I live together with all other lands which I am possessed of, and my slave Judy and all her children who are now in his possession, and one black walnut, calling table. I give to my daughter Rebecca Toney forever my slave Mary and her child and her increase from this day the said slave and her child being now in ~~her~~ ^{my} possession.

I give my still to ^{my} wife and ... sons Edmund and John during the widow^{hood} of my said wife, and do direct, that it shall remain at the place it now stands on the profit arising from it to be equally divided between them, and after the expiration of my wife's widowhood I give the said still to my sons Edmund & John.

It is my will that all the remaining part of my estate, money, goods & chattels be equally divided between my six children, Edmund, John, Elizabeth, Mary, Martha, and Rebecca. I do appoint my loving wife, signs Toney, and my sons Edmund Toney and John Toney, executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore made.

At a court held for Powhatan county the 19th day of August 1801 This last will and testament of Edmund Sney ^{de} was presented in open court and proved by the oath of Blagrove Taylor one of the subscribing witnesses and continued for further proof and at another court held for the aforesaid county the 16th day of September in the year aforesaid This will was again presented in court and further and fully proved by the oath of Frederick Woodson one of the subscribing witnesses and ordered to be recorded - And on the motion of Edmund Sney and John Sney two of the executors named in the said will certificates ^{there} in granted for returning probat thereof in due form they having made oath and entered into bond with security as the law directs.

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Edmund Toney and John Toney executors of the last will and Testament of Edmund Toney senior deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of them the said Edmund & John Toney or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them, and the same so made do exhibit into the court of Powhatan at such time as they shall be thereto required by the said court, and the same goods chattels

and credits do well and truly administer according to law
and make a just and true account of their actings & doings
therein when thereunto required by the said court, and
further do well and truly pay and deliver all the
legacies contained and specified in the said wills as
far as the said goods, chattels and credits will extend
according to the value thereof and as the law shall
charge. Then this obligation to become void, or other-
wise to remain in full force and virtue.
