I Elizabeth Bagby of the County of Powhatan being in my right and proper mind and memory do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament: Utterly revoking and disannulling all former wills made and ordained by me: And after my just debts and funeral charges are paid I dispose of my Estate in the following manner: Imprimis: It is my will and desire that I may be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my executor herein after named.

Item In order to make some amends to my daughter Jane Clarke for her particular care and attention to me in times of sickness, and the many services in various other respects she has rendered me since the death of my husband, I give and bequeath her my daughter Jane Clarke my negro woman known and called by the name of Ann, which I purchased from Chancellor Hyde Saunders, with all her future Increase my riding carriage and harness, my safe made by Jeph Lewis, and my Trunk with all my wearing Cloths to her my said daughter Jane Clarke and her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Frederick Clarke my bay horse known and call by the name of Jupiter, also my ox cart

and a young maid ~~of~~ work steers, to him my grandson Frederick
Clarke his heirs and assigns forever.

Item It is my will and desire that after the above specified
Legacies are discharged that the residue of my Estate be equal-
ly divided among my three children To wit, Lance Clarke Betsey
Smith deceased and Judith Clark deceased to them their heirs
and assigns forever. Item It is my will and desire that no
affirmment of my Estate may be made and that no bond
be required of my Executor.

And lastly appoint my son in law William Clarke to exe-
cute and fulfill this my last will and testament. In testimo-
ny whereof I have to these presents set my hand and affixed
my seal this thirty first day of August in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine.
