mind and memory (Praised be God) do this 15th day of May in the year
of our Lord 1795 make and publish this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following (That is to say) I am persuaded I committed
my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me, and my
Body to the Earth from whence it came in hopes of a joyfull
resurrection thro the Merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ. And as
for as that worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless
me I dispose thereof as follows.

Item I give to my son Gedon Thourney my negro man slave named Omer
to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son John Thourney my negro woman slave named
Polly & her increase to him & to his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Samuel Thourney my negro Boy named
Theoderick to him & to his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son David Thourney my negro girl named
Anniah and her increase to him & to his heirs forever.

Item I give my son Jordan Thourney my negro man slave
named Will to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Thomas Thourney my negro woman
named Harriah and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Silas Thourney my negro man named John
with my negroe girl named Malinda daughter of Anniah and her
increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Harris daughter
of Thomas Harris my negroe girl named Biddy and her
increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my grand Daughter Mary Harris Daughter of Thomas
Harris two black cattle and four sheep to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my grandson William B. Britton son of Elizabeth
Britton my negroe girl named Pat and her increase to him and
his heirs forever.

Item I give to my grand Daughter Nancy M. Thourney Daughter

for as that worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me I dispose thereof as follows.

Item I give to my son Geddes Flournoy my negro man slave named Omer to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son John Flournoy my negro woman slave named Pat & her increase to him & to his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Samuel Flournoy my negro Boy named Frederick to him & to his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son David Flournoy my negro girl named Patsiah and her increase to him & to his heirs for ever.

Item I give my son Jordan Flournoy my negro man slave named Bill to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Thomas Flournoy my negro woman named Hannah and her increase to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give to my son Silas Flournoy my negro man named Tom with my negro girl named Patsiah daughter of Hannah and her increase to him

Item I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Harris daughter of Charles Harris my negro girl named Betty and her increase to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give to my grand Daughter Mary Harris Daughter of Charles Harris two Black cattle and four sheep to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my grandson William D. Britton son of Elizabeth Britton my negro girl named Pat and her increase to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my grand Daughter Nancy M. Flournoy Daughter of David Flournoy my negro girl named Rachel and her increase to her in part to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give to my sons Thomas & Silas Flournoys all my Estate whatsoever not heretofore mentioned to be equally divided betwixt them.

Item I make constitute and ordain my beloved sons David and Jordan Flournoys Executors of this my last will.

A Court held for Piedmont County at Scotland on Thursday the 11th
day of May 1795. This last will and testament of Elizabeth Flournoy
deceased was presented to Court and proved by the oaths of William
Gubbell and Joseph Salter who were sworn by the Court and were
the Court ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of David
Flournoy and Jordan Flournoy Executors thereof a warrant was
made oath thereunto and together with William Snaper their
Security entered into and acknowledged by David Flournoy
jurat of One thousand nine hundred pounds conditioned as
the law directs. And a writ of error is granted. And it is ordered that
