two silver Table Spoons, that my daughter Catharine left me, with
a new feather Bed. It is my will that my two grand Daughters
Catharine Hobson and Nancy Hobson shall have a gentel Side
Saddle and Bridle; the furthmore my will that all my
waring apparel be equally divided between my two Daughters
And lastly it is my will that the Remainer of what I may have

a right to dispose of whether real or personal, shall go to my
above named son Joseph McLaurine. I do hereby appoint my
son Joseph McLaurine Executor of this my last Will and testament
revoking all Wills by me formerly made in Witness Whereof I have
hereunto affixed my hand and Seal this Eleventh day of
