

I Henry Cox of the Parish of Southam and County of Powhatan do make the following Testamentary disposition of my Estate.

First I give to my Son Richard and his Heirs the following slaves, Perrett, Henry, Warwick, Will, Egg, Agg, Jane and her Child Jeff, together with their increase, also my Bull, and the Fifty pounds and the Ten Barrells corn which I have lent him, together with my grey mare.

I give unto my Son Bartlett and his Heirs, all my Land of the following Slaves, Sam, Joe, Lidda, and her Child Sam Sam and their increase, also my Black mare and colt, all my present Crop, all my Household and Kitchen Furniture, my cart and one yoke Oxen, It is my desire the rest of my Stock should be equally divided between my Sons Richard and Bartlett which I give to them and their Heirs.

I give unto Lurghorne Tabb and his Heirs his Bonds that I have in my possession, one of them for two Hundred pounds, payable in June one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty nine. The other for Forty Five pounds Balance due March one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Seven, also Twenty five pounds which I lent him, also the Fifteen Barrell Corn I lent him and my Sorrel horse.

I give unto Richard Mosely and his Heirs the following Slaves, Frank, Shadrach, and Bess, also my young Sorrell mare.

I give unto my grand Son Henry Daniel and his Heirs, my negro Boy Jerry.

I give unto my Grand daughter Judith Daniel and her Heirs, my Negroe Boy James.

I give unto my Grandson Peyton Cox and his Heirs, Two Bonds I have in my Possession, one on John Clement for one Hundred Pounds, payable June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty nine. The other on John Clement for one Hundred pounds payable June one

Slaves, Sam, Coe, Lidda, and her child Sam and their Moors, also
my Black mare and colt, all my present Crop, all my Household and
Kitchen Furniture, my cart and one yoke Oxen, Its my wish the
rest of my stock should be equally divided between my sons Richard
and Carlton which I give to them and their heirs.

I give unto Lurghorne Tabb and his heirs his bond that I
have in my possession, one of them for Two Hundred pounds paya-
ble in June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty nine. The
other for Forty Five pounds Balance due March one thousand seven
hundred and Eighty seven, also Twenty five pounds which I
lent him, also the Fifteen Barrell Corn I lent him, also my
Sorel horse.

I give unto Richard Mosely and his Heirs the following Slaves,
Frank, Shadrach, and Bess, also my young Sorel mare.

I give unto my grand son Henry Daniel and his Heirs, my negro
Boy Jimmy.

I give unto my Grand daughter Judith Daniel Daniel
and her heirs, my Negroe Boy James.

I give unto my Grandson Peyton Cox and his Heirs, Two Bonds I
have in my Possession, one on John Clement for one Thousand
Pounds, payable June one thousand seven hundred and Eighty nine,
the other on John Tabb for Two Hundred pounds payable June one
thousand Eight Hundred and one, Should my Grandson Peyton Cox die
under age and without any Heir, I give the above Bonds equally
to be divided between my Grandsons Henry Cox and Vincent Cox
to them and their Heirs.

The Balance of John Clements Bond of Two Hundred pounds now
in my Possession I give to be equally divided between my Sons
Richard and Carlton. I give my Cart and Oxen Cox, to them and

and their Heirs

The Balance of the Corn due me from Abraham Clements I gave to be equally divided between my sons Richard and Bartlow and Langhorn I left to them and their Heirs

The money I paid to different persons for my son Henry's estate make no charge for

Lastly I do appoint my sons Richard and Bartlow Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all Wills by me heretofore made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal on this Twenty ninth day of July one thousand seven hundred and ninety

At a Court held for Powhatan County at Scottsville on Thursday the 16th day of June 1791 this last Will and Testament of Henry Fox was presented in Court and proved by the oaths of Francis E. Harris and Harrison Jones witnesses thereto and was by the Court ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Bartlow Fox an Executor therein named, who made oath to the said Will and signed with Richard Fox his Security Entered into and acknowledged Bond in the penalty of Two thousand pounds conditioned as the Law directs Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate thereof in due form
