I, James Coindexter, of the County of Powhatan, believing myself ill, knowing the uncertainty of life, and being of sound mind do make & publish this my last Will & Testament -

First I desire that all my just debts should be paid by my executors hereafter to be named as soon as they can possibly effect it.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Dorcia Coindexter during her widowhood the use of the land I have bargained with Jordan Harris for containing twentyfive acres, ~~situate~~ the lands of Samuel Pleasant, and lying on the North side of the main road leading to Pine-Creek Mill - and is detached from the other lands by the aforesaid road, for which I engaged to pay him the sum of Ninetyfive pounds - part of the purchase money has been paid to him, which will appear from my account book - the balance of the debt due to him for the land aforesaid I wish my Executors to discharge as soon as possible from the debt due to me, and from the sale of my shop tools & stock of timber in it when I entertain no doubt but Jordan ^{Harris} will execute such a title as my executors may think sufficient.

3rd I also give unto my beloved wife the use of my negro Girl named Nana, with all the personal estate I do possess of, so long as she remains a widow - In case of her again marrying - I desire that the whole of my

estate of every description, should be sold & the money arising therefrom, be equally divided between my Daughter Cinthia Leansly, my son James Leansly, & my daughter Rebecca Leansly.

4. After the payment of my debts, whatever balance there may be in the hands of my Executors arising from the sale of my tools &c before mentioned, and outstanding debts due to me I desire they may apply it for the benefit of my wife & children as they may think best -

5. I appoint my friends John Goode sen Samuel Pearsons & John Tho: Pearsons executors of this my last Will.
