At a Court held for Powhatan County the 25th day of Sept 1808. This Guardianship account of William Harris with the Estate of Robert Harris orphan of Benjamin Harris decd. was returned, sworn to, and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God amen. I Tabitha Price of the County of Powhatan being in my proper mind sense and memory reflecting on the uncertainty of life and certainty of death do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament which only revoking all former wills made by me. In the first place I commit my body to the earth from whence it came to be entored in a Christian like decent manner at the direction of my executors hereafter mentioned and my soul I resign to God who first gave it, hoping to enjoy happiness with him forever, and after my Just debts and funeral Charges are paid I dispose of my estate in the following manner. Inprimis I give and demise to Jane Lee daughter of Tabitha Lee a Negro Girl named Judith, which Negro Judith is now and has for sometime past been in her possession together with her future increase to her and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten, but in case the said Jane Lee should die without issue it is my will that the said Negro Judith and her increase be divided equally among her then surviving Brothers and Sisters to them and their heirs forever.

Item It is my will that the Sum of Sixty pounds Current Money of Virginia be raised out of my estate for purposes hereafter mentioned

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Fanny Fullum the sum of Twenty Pounds current Money to her and hers forever
 Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Judith Foster children the sum of Twenty Pounds current Money to them and their heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Paddy Bagby the sum of Twenty Pounds current Money to her and her heirs forever
 Item it is my will that at my decease that the whole of my estate be sold to the best advantage except the Negro girl Judith which I have in the former part of this Will given to Fanny Lee and after taking out the Sixty Pounds for the purposes before mentioned, that the remaining amount proceeding from the said sale be divided into eight equal parts and distributed as follows To wit: Item I give and bequeath to my son John Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate exclusive of the said sum of Sixty Pounds to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate exclusive of the said Sixty pounds as before mentioned to be divided among my daughter to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Pugh Williamson Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate remaining after the said sum of Sixty pounds is taken out for my said daughters as before mentioned, to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and devise to the Children of my daughter Judith Foster one eighth part of the said residue of my estate which will be remaining after the aforesaid sum of Sixty pounds is taken out as mentioned to be divided among my said daughters to them and their heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Fanny Fullum one eighth part of the

my estate be sold to ^{my nearest heirs} ~~except the negro girl~~ ^{except the negro girl} Judith which I have in the former part of this Will given to Nancy Lee and after taking out the Sixty Pounds for the purposes before mentioned, that the remaining amount proceeding from the said sale be divided into eight equal parts and distributed as follows To wit. Item I give and bequeath to my son John Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate exclusive of the said sum of Sixty Pounds to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son James Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate exclusive of the said Sixty pounds as before mentioned, to be divided among my said daughters to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Pugh Williamson Price one eighth part of the said residue of my estate remaining after the said sum of Sixty pounds is taken out for my said daughters as before mentioned, to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and devise to the Children of my daughter Judith Foster One eighth part of the said residue of my estate which will be remaining after the aforesaid sum of Sixty pounds is taken out as mentioned to be divided among my said daughters to them and their heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Fanny Pullum one Eighth part of the residue of my estate which will remain after the said Sum of Sixty Pounds is made out and apportioned among my said Daughters as before mentioned to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Patsy Bagby One Eighth part of the residue of my estate after the before mentioned Sixty Pounds is made out and apportioned among my said Daughters as before directed to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Charles Price's Children after taking out the said Sum of Sixty Pounds to be apportioned among my said Daughters, one Eighth part of the said residue of my estate to them and their Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Sarah Price's Children one eight part of the residue of my estate after the said Sum of Sixty Pounds is made out for my said Daughters as before directed, to them and their Heirs forever. And lastly I do constitute and appoint, My son in law James Bagby and my son James Price to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And it is my will that no apportionment of my estate be made. In testimony whereof I have ^{herein} set my hand and affixed my seal this Twenty seventh day of November One thousand seven hundred and ninety Seven.

At a Court holden for Powhatan County the 21st day of September 1806. This last Will and Testament of James Price died was presented in Court and read in the ear of William Clarke and Littleberry Howell two subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded.

And on the motion of James Bagby and James Price, executors therein named, who made oath thereto, and together with Samuel H. Sanders and Samuel Woodfin their securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted them for obtaining probate thereof in due form.
