

I John Macon of Buchanan County do make my last Will & Testament as
follows Viz I desire that my Executors pay all my last debts as soon as
possible. I lend to my Beloved Wife Gracy Macon my Lands in this
County together with the Negroes usually kept thereon (except
those made over to my daughters Cate & Martha as per Deed in King &
Durin Office) with all the Stocks of Horses, Cattle, Sheep & Hogs
Furniture of the House tools and utensils & Chariot & on the said Land
during her Natural Life. I lend at the death of my said Wife
I give the Lands, Negroes & other articles above lent her to my son
Robert C. Macon and his Heirs forever. I also give to him & his
Heirs forever my Tract of Land in Cumberland and County known
by the name of Scotts Tract wherein I actually Macon
formerly lived containing about Thirteen Hundred Acres.
I have also given to my daughters Cate, Martha, Peggy & Elizabeth
all the rest & residue of my Lands in Cumberland and County
(about Two thousand Nine hundred Acres be it more or less)
to be Equally divided among them when they come of age or
marry or when any two of them shall arrive to that period.
I also give to my said Daughters & to my son Robert all
the rest and residue of my Estate of what Nature & kind
soever in Equal proportions to be received by them when they come of
age or marry. Nevertheless should one of my said Daughters be
unmarried or under age when the part of the One and
those so dying I give to my son Robert and his Heirs forever
both of Land & other Estate of every Nature heretofore given them
And in case of the death of my said son Robert unmarried
or under age then I give the whole Estate heretofore given him to my
four Daughters in Equal proportions paying no estate duty
half blood which is my desire in no instance to take place in
the descent of my Estate or any part thereof. Item I give to
beloved Wife Gracy Macon all the Crops growing or gathered
into the Sheaf on my Land in Buchanan County at the time of my death.
I also give to my son Robert all the pounds of silver & gold which I have received during her
life.

I Give the Lands, Negroes & other articles above sent me to my son
Robert & Macon and his Heirs forever. I also give to him & his
Heirs forever my Tract of Land in Cumberland and County, known
by the name of Scotts Tract which in Hartwells Macon
County lies & containing about Thirteen Hundred Acres.
I Give to my daughters Catey, Martha, Peggy & Elizabeth
all the rest & residue of my Lands in Cumberland and County
(about Two Thousand Nine hundred Acres be it more or less)
to be Equally divided among them when they come of age or
Married or when any two of them shall arrive to that period.
I also give to my said Daughters & to my son Robert all
the rest and residue of my Estate of what Nature it be
sooner in Equal proportions to be received by them when they come of
age or Married. Nevertheless should one of my Daughters be
unmarried or under age then the part of the said one or
those so dying I give to my son Robert and his Heirs forever
both of Land & other Estate of every Nature, heretofore given them.
And in Case of the death of my said son Robert unmarried
or under age then I give the whole Estate heretofore given him to my
four Daughters in Equal proportions paying no distinction
half blood which is my desire in no instance that take place in
the descent of my Estate in any part thereof. Item, I give to
beloved Wife Gracy Macon all the Crops growing or gathered
into the House on the Lands lent her at the times of my death.
I also give to my said Wife Fifty pounds for her maintenance during her
widowhood to be paid by my Executors. The provision made in
this Will for my Wife I declare to be in Sense & Consideration
of her own. And lastly I appoint my Friends William Mason
& Simon Edm^d Logwood & Littleberry Mosley Jun^r my Executors
& Guardians to my Children, who I will that be bound
speciously not to appraise my Estate at shame of all Confidence with them
In Witness to which I sign & put my Hand and Seal this
24th day of Feb^r 1793

Codrick to my Will made on this Sheet of paper dated the
month Feb^y 1793 Item I give to my Son Rob^t Macon
a Negroe Woman called Phillis & her Son Farleton
with all her fixtures Increase to him & his heirs forever
Item I give to my daughters Peggy & Elizabeth Two hundred
and fifty pounds Each to be paid them out of my Estate
before any One of my Children shall receive the proportion
allotted them in my Will as witness my hand this 15th
March 1793 John Macon

This paper contains my last Will written with my
own hand this 9th Feb^y 1793 J Macon

At a Court held for Powhatan County at South Hill
On Thursday the Nineteenth day of December One
thousand Seven hundred and ninety three This last
Will & Testament with the Codicils was presented in
Court and proved by the Oaths of William Macony &
Jeffery Davis witnesses thereto and ordered to be
proved on the Motion of William Macony & Littleberry & that
two of the Executors therein named who made oath
that to prove the same is granted them with leave for
the other Executors to come in and qualify when he shall
think proper.
