Agreeable to order of Powhatan Court we the undersigned have divided the above named Negroes, in manner following (to wit) N^o 1. as above stated falls to William Barrington N^o 2. to Francis Goose

A Court held for Powhatan County the 19th day of December 1804. This division of Slaves was returned and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God Amen. I John Smith of the County of Powhatan being sick and weak but of perfect sense and Memory and of disposing mind (for which I thank God) do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following, to wit my Will, and Desire is, that all my just debts shall be paid by my Executors hereafter to be named.

Item I give to my beloved Wife Mary Smith, all the Lands whereon I live, also the use of my two Negroes Biddy & Potty, with my stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, and Hogs, Household and Kitchen Furniture, and Plantation Tools

during her life. I also give to my Wife Mary Smith all the money that ^{may} I have in hand and all that may be due to me at my death in fee simple.

Item, I give to my beloved son William Smith my land and Plantation whereon I now live also my Negro Boy Betty after the Death of his Mother in fee simple also one feather Bed and turnstone and one Horse which he is to have choice.

Item my Will and desire is that Peery with the balance of my Estate of whatsoever kind be sold and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst the balance of my children.

Lastly, I appoint my beloved son William Smith and my Friend Elisha Macey Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Powhatan County Wills 1797-1806
