Will
In the name of God, I Josiah Thompson of the County of
Powhatan, being of sound memory do constitute and make this
my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following
After my legal debts are paid I lend my beloved Wife Sally
Thompson the ~~Land~~ whereon I now live, on appomattox River in the
County aforesaid, during her natural life, in widowhood, with all my
personal property for the material maintenance of herself and my
children begotten of her Viz George Thompson, Patsy Thompson,
Catherine Thompson and Angelica Thompson, The Education of
the above mentioned Children to be included in the above, I leave
The income of the above Estate appropriated to the use mentioned
reserving a legacy hereafter to be mentioned -
I gave to my son George Thompson, and his Heirs after the
death or marriage of his Mother Sally Thompson the Tract
of Land, as aforesaid lent to his said Mother, he paying Two
hundred and forty pounds to be equally divided amongst his
three Sisters, Patsy, Catherine, and Angelica And of on the

death or marriage of his Mother Sally Thompson the two hundred and forty pounds, ~~shall~~ not be raised, my Will and desire is that the Land be rented out until that sum is, acquired, and each of my said three Daughters, gets her equal proportion as devised here. To my son William Thompson; by a former Wife, I give and bequeath, One hundred pounds currency, to be paid in the four, succeeding years after my death. Twenty five pounds, annually, until the hundred pounds, are paid, to be raised from the crops made on the Land devised George & rent my beloved Wife as aforesaid and on the Death or marriage of my Wife, Sally Thompson, my Will and desire is that all my personal Estate of every kind,

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whatever to be equally divided between my aforesaid three daughters Patsy Thompson, Catherine Thompson, and Angelica Thompson but should either of those girls die before marriage, or if married not having four or five of her Body, or not having attained the age of Twenty one years, then my Will is that the part belonging to the said deceased shall be divided between the surviving sisters or their legal representatives -

As I have heretofore given property to my children by my first Wife Viz Joseph Thompson, Thomas Swann, Thompson Hardy Thompson and Mary Marshall, Watkins I hereby ratify and confirm the gifts to them and their Heirs forever, and my Will is that whatever I give to Thomas Swann Thompson, shall be equally divided amongst his children when they Mary or arrive to the age of

my son Joseph Thompson, my former wife, gave me be-
neath, One hundred pounds currency, to be paid in the four, suc-
ceeding years after my death. Twenty five pounds, annually, until
the hundred pounds, are paid, to be raised from the crops made
on the Land devised George & Kent my beloved Wife as aforesaid
and on the Death or marriage of my Wife, Sally Thompson, my
Will and desire is that all my personal Estate of every kind
whatever to be equally divided between my aforesaid Three daughters
Betsy Thompson, Catherine Thompson, and Angelica Thompson but
should either of those Girls die before marriage, or if married
not having Four or Fours of her Body, or not having attained the
age of Twenty One years, then my Will is that the part devised
to the said deceased shall be divided between the surviving
Sisters or their legal representatives.

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As I have heretofore given property to my children by my first
Wife viz Joseph Thompson, Thomas Swann, Thompson Waddy Thompson
and Mary Marshall Watkins, I hereby ratify and confirm the gifts
to them and their Heirs forever, and my Will is that whatever
I give to Thomas Swann Thompson, shall be equally divided
amongst his children when they marry or arrive to the age of
an alerity -

I appoint my son Josiah Thompson and Thomas Watkins
Executors to this my last Will and Testament in Confirmation

obligation is such, that if the above bound Isaac Thompson
 Executor of the last will and Testament of Isaac Thompson deceased
 do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the
 goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased, which have or
 shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the
 said Isaac Thompson, or into the hands or possession of any other
 person or persons for him, and the same so made do exhibit unto
 the County Court of Powhatan, at such time as he shall be
 thereto required by the said Court, and the same goods chattels
 and credits, do well and truly, administer, according to Law; and
 make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein
 when thereto required by the said Court, and further do well & truly
 pay and deliver all the legacies, contained, and specified in the
 said Will, as far as the said goods, chattels, and credits will
 extend, according to the value thereof, and as the Law shall
