

In the name of God amen, I Judith Dupuy of the County of Chesterfield, (tho residing in Powhatan at present) do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament, in manner and form following Viz.

Item: I give and devise unto my son John Watkins one Negro man named Cesar, to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my son Benjamin Watkins one man named Dick, also one negro woman named Annaky, and one Negro Child named Samson of Nancy to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my daughter Judith Walker one Negro woman named Betsey, also one leather bed and furniture, to her and to her heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my grandson Joseph Watkins one Negro woman named Sindy, with her increase to him and to his heirs forever. Item: I give and devise unto my grandson Benjamin Watkins (son of Joseph) one Negro man named Bob to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my grandson Francis Watkins one hundred and sixty one Aers of land, be the same more or less, adjoining my plantation (which land I purchased of Perren Giles) to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my grandson David Watkins one Negro man named Jimmy to him and to his heirs forever.

Item: I give and devise unto my grandson Berry Watkins one Negro Child named Jacob (son of Nancy) to him and to his heirs forever. Item: I give and devise unto my grand daughter Martha Jennings one Negro woman named Nancy, also her child Cesar and her future increase to him and to her heirs forever.

Witness my hand and seal this 1st day of October 1806.

One man named Dick, also one negro woman named Annaky, and one Negro Child named Samson of Nancy to him and to his heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my daughter Judith Walker One Negro woman named Betsey also one feather bed and furniture, to her and to her heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my grandson Joseph Watkins One Negro woman named Lincy with her increase to him and to his heirs forever. Item I give and devise unto my grandson Benjamin Watkins (son of Joseph) One Negro man named Bob to him and to his heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my grandson Francis Watkins One hundred and sixty one Acres of land, be the same more or less, adjoining my plantation (which land I purchased of Perren Giles) to him and to his heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my grandson David Watkins One Negro man named Jimmy to him and to his heirs forever.

Item. I give and devise unto my grandson Henry Watkins One Negro Child named Jacob (son of Nancy) to him and to his heirs forever. Item. I give and devise unto my grand daughter Martha Jennings One Negro woman named Nancy, also her child

Cesar and her future increase to him and to her heirs forever.

Item. I also desire all my Estate that has not been given away above, be given unto my son Bere Watkins to him and to his heirs forever, exceptit Sarah, which I wish to be freed or set at Liberty. And lastly I appoint and ordain my son Benjamin Watkins, Francis Watkins & John Watkins Executors to this my last will and testament, revoking all former Wills made by me declaring this to be my last will. In witness whereof I

have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and nine. I desire my Estate be not appraised.
