and County of Dorchester she being in her perfect senses.

I give and bequeath unto Mary Ann Spiers, James Moss, Francis Moss
John Davenport, Stephen Moss William Moss and Tabitha Moss
my sons and Daughters all my stock of Horses, except one called the
bay colt which I give my Daughter Tabitha all my cattle sheep &c &c to
be equally Divided amongst them except James Moss and Mary Ann Spiers
who shall have a cow and calf a piece, which they are to allow for their
Division to them and their heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto
James Moss my grand Daughter a Feather bed and furniture.
Also I give a Bed and furniture to each of my children Stephen, William
and Tabitha to them and their heirs forever and it is my Will
that my neighbours Nicholas Spiers and John Haddon who shall
have my Horses make a Division of the above as they shall think
proper which Division is to be binding on all the Heirs of all
whom of I declare the writing to be my last will and Testament this
fourth day July 1790

It is Court held for Powhatan County at Scotland on Thursday the 14 day of August 1790. The last will and testament of Mary Moss deceased was presented in Court by Nicholas Spears an Executor therein named & proved by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto and by the Court was ordered to be recorded as such on the Motion of the said Executor when said Oath were taken together with the said Mary Moss her security entered into & acknowledged their said Mortality as the law directs in such cases. *Wm.
