in the County of Powhatan do make and Ordain this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form as follows.

1. my desire is that my Executors hereafter mentioned do make such
Improvements on my Land as they shall think necessary for the
Support of my Family and that they sell such a part of my stock
as they think can be best spared to pay the expences and then my
Desire is that after my Just debts are paid the Rest of my Est^{ty} be kept
together, untill my Daughter Mary Arrives to the Age of Eighteen
and then all my Est^{ty} (Land excepted) be Equally divided between
my Wife & my three Children William, Jesse & Mary and that my
Wife have the Use of my Land during her life and at her Death
my Land to be Equally Divided Between my two Sons William &
Jesse their heirs for ever. Further Whereas my Father in Law Samuel
Sanderson has promised to give my Son Samuel Popper a Negroe &
I have omitted giving my Son Saml any part of my Est^{ty} I have
now in possession, but if my s^d Father in Law should not give my
s^d Son Samuel any part of his Est^{ty} as he has promised, then my
Will is that he should have an Equal part, of my Est^{ty} with the
Rest of my Children at the Division as is above mentioned and
my desire is that my Est^{ty} be not appraised.

Lastly I do appoint my Friends George Smith & Anthony Martin
Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Revoking all other
Wills made by me heretofore as W^m Test^{ment} my hand and Seal
this Seventeenth day of Sept^r. One thousand seven hundred and
eighty four.
