 in the following manner to wit, I give to my Husband Wil-
 liam Wilbourn the following Slaves to wit, Hannah, Billy, Phillis,
 Dick, Mully, Jane, Jude, Sally, and James to him and his heirs
 forever - I do also give to my Husband William Wilbourn, one
 Feather Bed & Furniture, which he is in possession of to him
 and his heirs forever; which said Slaves & Bed &c., are all in
 possession of William Wilbourn my said Husband - Lastly I con-
 stitute and do appoint William Wilbourn, my Sole and sole Executor
 of this my last will and Testament, requesting that there should
 not be security required of him as my Executor aforesaid by the
 County Court of Powhatan, where it is my wish that this my last
 will, should be recorded of which I have here-
 unto, set my hand and Seal, acknowledging this to be my last
 Will and desire, this 13th day of April in the year of our Lord One
 thousand Eight hundred and three -
