 negro slaves, Britain and Dandridge now in her possession
 to her and her heirs forever. I give to my daughter Betsey
 Terlines my two negro Slaves, Leason and Jude, to her
 and her heirs forever. I give to my Grand-Daughter Anne
 the Daughter of ~~William~~ ^{William} ~~William~~ ^{William} my negro Slave Succ
 now in her possession forever. I give to my Daughter
 Agnes Lewis my two negro Slaves now in her posses-
 sion, Isack & Julius forever. I give my Grand Daughter
 Polly Lewis my negro Slave Polly now in her
 Possession forever. I lend to my daughter Judith
 Good, my two Slaves, Dick and Cloe, about nine years
 old, to remain with her Mother or next best friend
 for a comfortable maintenance, but in case she
 should marrie, and have lawful heirs of her body
 in that case I give the said negro Slaves Dick and
 Cloe, to such heirs forever, after her death. I lend my
 Daughter Susanna Sally my two negro Slaves James
 & Dilue, during her life and at her death, I give the
 said Slaves James and Dilue to the heirs of her body
 lawfully begoten forever, if she should have any

also I give my wife Elizabeth Goode, one fifty pounds,

and her heirs forever. I give to my Grand-Daughter Anne
the Daughter of Betsey Terlines, my negro Slave Succ
now in her possession forever. I give to my Daughter
Agness Lewis, my two negro Slaves now in her posses-
sion, Isaac & Susan forever. I give my Grand Daughter
Polly Lewis my negro Slave Polly now in her
possession forever. I lend to my daughter Judith
Goode, my two Slaves, Dick and Cloe, about nine years
old, to remain with her mother or next best friend
for a comfortable maintenance, but in case she
should marrie, and have lawful heirs of her body
in that case I give the said negro Slaves Dick and
Cloe, to such heirs forever, after her death. I lend my
Daughter Susanna Sally my two negro Slaves, Samer
& Dilue, during her life and at her death, I give the
said Slaves Samer and Dilue to the heirs of her body
lawfully begoten forever, if she should have such heirs
if not the said two slaves Samer & Dilue and their
increas, are to be equally divided between the rest of my
children or the heirs of their body lawfully begoten.

My Will and desire is at the Death of my wife Elizabeth
Goode, my Personal estate at that time may be equally
divided between my five children, Fanny Lindsey, Betsey

Salines, & Agnes Lewis, Judith Goode, Susanna Sallee
 as above directed without any sale, my Will further is
 my land in Powhatan at the same time be sold at
 two years credit, and the money arising from that sale
 be equally divided among my five children as above directed,
 my will and desire is that my beloved wife, my friend
 Matthew Silson, Frederick Woodson, be appointed executor
 to this my last Will and Testament given under my
 hand this twentieth day of February one thousand eight
