This being the last Will and Testament of Thomas Wills in the name of
God Amen I hereby recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth
to be buried at the discretion of my Executors. Item I give and bequeath unto
Stovall and his son Talitha all Bills, Bonds, Obligations, Dues, Debts and
Demands. Item I give and bequeath unto Jesse Stovall five pounds to see my
Will performed. I deny all Wills, Rights or Testaments made by me before this day
and date my Estate not to be proved than Jesse Stovall my whole and sole Executor
showing last Will and Testament. In Witness where of I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this day the twenty first of March 1789

At a Court held for Powhatan County the 19th day of June 1788 the last Will and
Testament of Thomas Wills deceased was presented in Court and proved by the oath of
the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Jesse Stovall the Executor
therein named, who made oath thereto, and with Bartholomew Stovall his Security entered
into and acknowledges their Bond in the penalty of two hundred and fifty pounds
conditioned as the law directs to certify to be granted him for obtaining probate in due form
