 In the name of God amen. I Chillion White of the County of
 Powhatan, of sound perfect and disposing sense and memory, do make
 ordain constitute and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament
 in manner & form following, First it is my desire that my body
 be decently interred in the plainest manner, and as to what worldly
 estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me (after my just debts
 are paid) I dispose of in manner & form following.

I bind to my wife, Elizabeth White, during her natural life, the
 use of my whole estate both real and personal, (except it be two Cows
 and calves which I give to my son Thomas White, and a bay
 horse colt which I give to my son John White) subjecting my said
 wife Elizabeth to the maintenance and Education of my children
 by her, to wit, Polly, Polly, Persimmon, Judith Boulton, John & Elizabeth
 and at the death of my said wife Elizabeth, it is my wish and
 desire, that the whole of my estate both real and personal but
 to my said wife Elizabeth be sold, and the money arising from the sale
 thereof, be equally divided among such of my children by my said wife
 Elizabeth as may be then living; should either or any of my daughters
 marry and die (before my said wife dies) leaving no lawful issue,
 the surviving husband of said daughter, or daughters, shall not claim
 any part of my said estate, and should my said wife Elizabeth
 marry again, it is my desire that she, with the man she may
 marry, be compell'd by my executors hereafter named to give bond
 and security, not only for the support and education of my children,
 by my said wife Elizabeth, but that no waste be made of the estate.
 I have loaned my said wife, and in feeking to do so for two months
 after marriage, that my Executors take the estate out of their hands
 and sell it for the benefit of such of my children, by her that may
 be then living. — I do hereby appoint my Brother in Law James Tucker,

Barwell Tucker and Littleberry Tucker guardians and Executors to
this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore
made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affix my
seal this twentysecond day of September, 1806, eighteen hundred
and six.
