11 This week in Beddy do make this my Last will and Testament It is my will and Desire that all my just debts be Paid I leave to my Beloved Wife all my Estate both Real and Personal leaving her natural life I give and bequeath to my son Jacob one Negro girl named Peg to him and his heirs forever I leave to my Daughter Mary one shilling sterling to her and her heirs forever I leave to my Daughter Judith one shilling sterling to her and her heirs forever I leave to my Daughter Elizabeth one negro girl named Agge to her and her heirs forever I leave to my Daughter Susanah one Negro girl named Sall to her and her heirs forever I leave my will and Desire that the Rest of my Estate both Real and Personal be equally divided between my five sons William Jacob and Nathaniel and John and Paul Michael

I appoint and constitute Jacob Curingham and William Curingham with Nathan my beloved wife all of this my Last will and Testament and as witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14 Day of September 1778
