one negro girl named Fannie to her and her heirs forever Item I give to my
Daughter Susannah one Negro girl Named Sally to her and her heirs
forever Item my will also desire that the rest of my Estate both personal
and real to be equally divided between my five sons William, Jacob and
Matthew and John and Paul Birmingham.

I present and constitute Joseph Birmingham and William Birmingham
with others my beloved wife tott of this my last will and testament and
doe command them which above have been witness unto me to affix their
seals to this my last will and testament this 21 day of February 1778.

At the Old Newgate Court 1778 This last will and testament of
Isaac Birmingham deceased was presented in court by Joseph
Birmingham one of the executors there named William Birmingham
disinheriting his right to execution in court & the will was proved
by the Master of the Court, whereupon the Joseph gave bond and took
the oath required by law to certificate for obtaining a probate thereof
in due form is granted him and leave for Roger Birmingham to take
execution at another day
