last Will and Testament Fully Making Words and Null all wills
and Testaments by me hitherto made

Item I give to my Daughter Letitia Vainon what she hath all Ready
in her possession to her and her Heirs for Ever

Item I Give to my Son James Hambleton two Negroes (to wit)
Nan and Ben Also one Hundred and fifty pounds cash also
one Riding Horse & Saddle allowing him to take his choice of all my
Horses also one feather Bed and furniture to him and his Heirs
for Ever

Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Hambleton one Negro Boy
Named Isaac also one Horse worth ten pounds also one Saddle
one feather Bed and furniture to her and her Heirs for ever

Item I Give to my Son Alexander Hambleton one Negro man
Named Dick also one Horse and Saddle giving him choice
of all my Horses after my Son James hath taken his Horse

of all my money as for my son James, I have taken his Horse
out of them - alls one feather Bed and furniture to him and
his Hairs forever -

Item) I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Hambleton one Negro Girl
Named Agg alls one feather Bed and furniture one Horse worth
ten pounds, alls one saddle to Her and Her Hairs forever -

Item) I Give to my Daughter Ann Hambleton one Negro Girl
Named Hamner one Horse worth ten pounds, alls one saddle
one feather Bed and furniture to Her and Her Hairs forever -

Item) I Give to my Daughter Rebecca Hambleton one Negro Girl
Named Lucy one Horse worth ten pounds, one saddle alls
one feather Bed and furniture to her and Her Hairs forever -

Item) I Give to my Son Samuel Hambleton two Negroes (to wit)
Lucy and Abram alls fifty pounds Cash to be applied
towards his Education - alls one Horse worth ten pounds, alls
one feather Bed and furniture one Man's saddle to him and
His Hairs forever -

Item) I Give to my Grandson Hambleton Warren one Negro Boy named Jacob to him and his Heirs forever.

Item) My Will and Desire is that the Land Wharson I now live may be Divided Between my two Sons Alexander and Samuel after my wife's Death or Intermarriage in such manner and form as my Executors shall think Best Giving Alexander the North part and Samuel the South part Reserving to Samuel Dwelling House and Meadow.

Item) I Give to my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Hambleton two Negroes during her Natural Life or Widowhood: two Negroes to wit) one male and one female the Land and premises wharson I now live: Also all my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Hogs, and Sheep - all my House Hold and Kitchen furniture also all my plantation utensils Except the Lagers before Given - Also my crop of Corn fodder Wheat Oats &c. &c. Also the still now planted on the Land: Reserving to my three Sons James, Alexander and Samuel - Each one fourth part of the profits arising from the said still provided they occur and attend to the same.

they occupy and attend her - and after my wife's Death or Intermarriage
my Will and Desire is that the whole Estate Left in my wife's pos-
session be Equally Divided Between my three Sons Before mentioned.
The Money that may Remane after paying the Legacies Before Men-
tioned I give to my Beloved Wife Elisabeth Hambleton

Item) My will and Desire is that if any of my Children die under
age or without Lawful Issue their Part of my Estate to be Equally
Divided Between the Surviving Sons and their Issue - My will is
that there be no appraisement of my Estate

Now to conclude this my Last will and Testament I do appoint my
Beloved Wife Elisabeth Hambleton and James Hambleton Executors
of this my Last will and Testament in witness whereof I have Hereunto
set my Hand and Seale this 9th Day December 1789

At a Court held for Prince Edwards County April 19. 1798. This last
Will and Testament of Alexander Hamilton deceased was proved
by Ambrose Nelson and Caleb Baker and ordered to be recorded

the oath required by Law Certificate for obtaining a probat
thereof in due form is granted them, &c
