

Andrew Elliott of N. York, hereby do make this my last Will and Testament as follows:  
My Will and desire is that my beloved Wife Nancy live in my house and have the use of my  
Plantations on the north side of the Great Road during her widowhood. I also that my beloved Wife Nancy  
my Negro man, Jacob Isaac, Esther Polly, and John Isaac, during the above term of her widowhood  
I also give my beloved Wife Nancy my Negro woman Dunch and her children Phill and her son  
John and her three sons, I also give my beloved Wife Nancy one third part of my house, etc and  
children furniture one third part of my Plantation utensils, and one third of all my land. Stock  
I will and desire that the house now on hand be furnished with the provisions now laid in and the purchase  
to be paid out the money due to me. The Tobacco stored and the large on hand, the remainder after paying  
other debts to be equally divided between Nancy my beloved Wife, and my three sons their part to be  
considered as Stock in the hands of their Guardians for schooling and other necessary charges

My Will and desire is that my son John Elliot shall have all my lands on the north side of the great  
Road and the East end of my lands on the South side of the Great road up as far as the rocky point  
in the Great Road opposite to my dwelling house where I order that a straight line be run from said  
Rocky point to Schenck's Buffalo line, where Polecat branch crosses the line to him my son  
John and his heirs forever. My will and desire is that the remainder of my lands be equally divided between  
my sons Allen Monck Elliott and William Elliott to them and their heirs forever. The apportion  
division to be made within twelve months after my decease, and the remainder of the Negroes  
Stock and utensils not given or sent, I order to be divided (as best appears for the Stock as my  
Executors may think advantageous) to be sold on Allen and William's lands, and their like  
Contents to be sold they are Demanded as well as hereafter devised and the profits thereof (or such a

My Will and desire is that my son John Elliott shall have all my slaves on the north side of the Great Road and the East end of my slaves on the South side of the Great road up as far as the Rocky Point in the Great Road opposite to my dwelling house where I order that a straight line be run from said Rocky Point to Schesters Pelichin Buffalo line, where Political branch crosses the line to him my son John and his heirs forever, My will and desire is that the remainder of my slaves be equally divided between my sons Allen Mowatt Elliott and William Elliott to them and their heirs forever, The apportioned division to be made within twelve months after my decease, and the remainder of the Negroes Stock and Materials not given or sent, I order to be divided (as such apart from the Stock as my Executors may think advantageous) to be divided on Allen and William's share, and there the Controversy until they are Divided, as well be hereafter divided and the profits thereof (on such a part thereof as may be required) I order to go to Schesters and other charges for my three sons and as all are slaves will be wanting for said people and Stock I order that they have the privilege of any improvements on the South side of the Great Road, till they are provided with a sufficiency - My Will and desire is that said Negroes and Stock with the balance of their profits and the sale of Stock if any be sold shall be equally divided between my three sons John Elliott, Allen M. Elliott and William Elliott as they came of Age, as also the negroes sent my beloved Wife Nancy when they return. Nevertheless I order that my three sons bear one another's losses in the Negroes by Death or share in the profits until the youngest be of Age to receive his part, and as there is a loss of land by the

This last Will and Testament of Andrew Elliott deceased was presented in Court and proved by the  
 Oaths of Nathaniel Frie and William Scott Witnesses thereof, namely that the same be Read  
 On the motion of Nancy Elliott and William Womack Executors and Executors Herein named -  
 who with James Biggar and William J. Walker their Seniors called into and acknowledged their  
 bond in the penalty of Four thousand Pounds and took the Oath required by Law in Great Britain for  
 obtaining a probate thereof in due form is Granted them, - and licence is granted to their Executors  
 there named to take Execution thereof as they shall think fit.
