

Andrew Elliott of N. York, lawfully do make this my last Will and Testament as follows:  
My Will and desire is that my beloved Wife Nancy live in my house and have the use of my  
Plantations on the south side of the Great Road during her widowhood. I also give my beloved Wife Nancy  
my Negro man, Jacob Isaac, Esther Polly, and John Isaac, during the above term of her widowhood  
I also give my beloved Wife Nancy my Negro woman Dunch and her children Phill and her mother  
John and her three parsons, I also give my beloved Wife Nancy one third part of my house, old and  
children furniture one third part of my Plantation utensils, and one third of all my land, Stock  
My will and desire is that the house now on hand be finished, with the provisions now laid in and the purchase  
to be paid out the money due to me. The Tobacco woods and the large on hand, the remainder after paying  
other debts to be equally divided between Nancy my beloved Wife, and my three sons their part to be  
considered as Stock in the hands of their Guardians for schooling and other necessary charges

My Will and desire is that my son John Elliot shall have all my lands on the north side of the great  
Road and the East end of my land on the South side of the Great road up as far as the rocky point  
in the Great Road opposite to my dwelling house where I order that a straight line be run from said  
Rocky point to Charles Pelchies Buffaton line, where Potomac branch crosses the line to him my son  
John and his heirs forever, My will and desire is that the remainder of my lands be equally divided between  
my sons Allen Monack Elliot and William Elliot to them and their heirs forever, The appraisal  
division to be made within twelve months after my decease, and the remainder of the Negroes  
Stock and utensils not given or sent, I order to be divided (as best appears to the Stock as may  
be equal to may think advantageous) to be sold on Allen and William's land, and their like  
Conditions as to the they are Demanded, as will be here after devised and the profits thereof (or such a

My Will and desire is that my son John Elliott shall have all my slaves on the north side of the Great Road and the East end of my slaves on the South side of the Great Road up as far as the Rocky Point in the Great Road opposite to my dwelling house where I order that a straight line be run from said Rocky Point to Schesters Pelchins Buffalo line, where Political Branch crosses the line to him my son John and his heirs forever, My will and desire is that the remainder of my Slaves be equally divided between my sons Allen Mowatt Elliott and William Elliott to them and their heirs forever, The apportioned division to be made within twelve months after my decease, and the remainder of the Negroes Stock and Materials not given or sent, I order to be settled (as such apart from the Stock as my Executors may think advantageous) to be divided on Allen and William Slaves, and their heirs forever until they are Deceased, as well be hereafter divided and the profits thereof (or such a part thereof as may be required) I order to go to Schesters and other charges for my three years and as Affairs stand will be wanting for said People and Stock I order that they have the privilege of any improvements on the South side of the Great Road, till they are provided with a sufficiency - My Will and desire is that said Negroes and Stock with the balance of their profits and the sale of Stock if any be sold shall be equally divided between my three sons John Elliott, Allen M. Elliott and William Elliott as they come of Age, as also the negroes sent my beloved Wife Nancy when they return. Nevertheless I order that my three sons be as one another Slaves in the Negroes by Death or share in the profits with the youngest of Age to receive his part, and as there is a Trust of land regarding

I have read and have caused to my true self  
 that the business here an equal division of said is immovable, and any part of my estate  
 and before mentioned like equally divided between my three sons - And truly I affirm my  
 letters Miss Nancy M<sup>rs</sup> Womack son and my friend Mr. John Executors to this my last  
 will and Mr. Womack son and Mr. Womack son Guardians to my son - Mr. Womack  
 witness these hands so my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day 1797,
