between them that if my wife should bring a Son, being now with Child.
The other half of my personal Estate to be equally divided among my Children
when the eldest comes of Age and the half given to my wife to be divided
among my Children at her death, and further my will and desire is
that if any of my Children should die before they arrive to Lawfull
Age or marriage that then his or her part as a love given to be
divided equally among the Rest of my surviving Children and lastly I appoint
Anthony Weston, John Johns & Jacob Woodson Executors to this my last
Will. Given under my hand and Seal this 13th Day of October 1786.
