

Will - but of sound mind and memory but calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal life do constitute this my last Will and Testament wishing all others past it is my will and desire that all my last debts be paid

Secondly I give and bequeir to my Son John Wallthall that part of my tract of Land that he now lives on and bounded as followeth; Beginning on the great branch one hundred and fifty yars above the Ten Vail thence a straight line to the spring now used by my son Christopher thence down the said Spring branch to Ellingtons Mill pond, it being a part of a Tract of Land I purchased of Alexander Marshall all which Land I give to him and his heirs forever

Thirdly I give and bequeir to my son Christopher Wallthall all the remainder of the aforesaid Tract of Land purchased of Alexander Marshall to him and his heirs forever

Fourthly I give and bequeir to my Daughter Nancy Washins one Negro woman named Nancy and one Yearl got named Lily, and their increase which said Negroes are now in her possession to her and her heirs forever I give them

Fifthly I give and bequeir to my Daughter Elizabeth Washins one Negro Woman named Liza and her increase and sixty pounds Cash to her and her heirs forever

Sixthly I give and bequeir to my Daughter Abigail one Abatto girl named Clarice and her increase and a Negro Boy named Boodle when she comes to Lawful age or Marriage also one rather Bed and Furniture one good horse saddle and Bridle to her and her heirs forever but should my said Daughter depart this life before she comes to Lawful age or Marriage then it is my desire that the aforesaid Negroes and truly said to be given be equally divided amongst all my sons to wit John, Prunch, Christopher, Francis, Henry, to them and their heirs forever

And I will and desire is that all the remainder part of my estate not already given away be to it together

all my son Henry arrives to Lawful age, or the comfort and support of my beloved Wife and two youngest
children also in the purpose of raising three hundred pounds or each of my two sons Francis and Henry and it is
my desire that my son Francis receive his three hundred pounds as soon as it can be raised by the inspection of
my estate also one feather bed and furniture and a good horse saddle and bridle to him and his heirs forever.
It is also my Will and desire that the aforesaid three hundred pounds allotted for my son Henry be paid to him
when he arrives to Lawful age also one feather bed and furniture and one good horse saddle and bridle, but in case
the three hundred pounds should not be raised by the aforesaid time then it is my desire that my son Henry
receive out of my estate Negroes to the value thereof which I give him with the increase thereof during
his life and his heirs forever. I Give unto my well beloved Wife Rebecca all my Land lying on
the East side of the Road that runs through my Tract during her Natural Life, and when my son
Henry arrives to Lawful age one third part of my Negroes and stock of all kinds and one bed and furniture
during her natural Life, my Land on the North side of the road I give to my son Branch with one feather
bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever. My Will and desire is that my Lot of Negroes I lend
to my beloved Wife at the division of my estate should after her death be equally divided between my three
Daughters, Nancy, Elizabeth and Phebeance all which Negroes I give with their Increase to him and his heirs
forever. I give unto my son Branch after the death of his Mother all the remainder of my Land not already
given to him and his heirs forever. It is also my desire that the remainder of my personal estate when my son
comes to Lawful age may be equally divided among my five sons to wit John, Branch, Henry, Francis
and Henry, all which I give to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I constitute and appoint my
well beloved Wife and my two sons John Wallhall and Branch Wallhall Executors and Administrators of the

130 my last Will and Testament, touching all others then as on Wills where I have executed in my hand and affix my seal the twenty sixth day of December one thousand seven hundred and Ninety Eight. It is also my wish and desire that the third part of my Stock and furniture left to my Wife as hereunto be equally divided among my three Daughters (to wit) Nancy, Elizabeth and Rebecca.

At a Court held for Prince Edward County, February the 18th 1799

This last Will and Testament of Christopher Wallthall deceased was presented in Court and proved by the oaths of John Kelso and John Hutchinson two of the Witnesses thereto ordered that the same be recorded in the motions of John Wallthall one of the Executors therein named who with Josiah Parkinson, Daniel Ellington and Jeremiah Farley his Secular entered into and acknowledged their bond for that purpose according to Law and took the oath required by Law certificate for obtaining a probat in due form is granted him and leave given the other Executors therein named to take execution at another day. And at another Court held for said County April 18th 1799 on the motion of Palmer Wallthall and George Wallthall Executors & Co-authors signed in this last Will & Testament of Christopher Wallthall deceased who with Alexander Marshall & John Hartney their Secular entered into and acknowledged their bond for that purpose in the sum of two thousand pounds according to Law and took the oath required by Law Certificate for obtaining a probat thereof in due form is granted them.
