 my worldly goods that Lord has been pleased to bestow on me first and principally my
 will and desires that all my Just debts shall be paid;

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Holland when she comes of age or
 marryeth two negro girls one of them to be about twelve or fifteen years old and the other
 about seven or eight years old out of my Estate also a good Horse and saddle to her and
 her Hens and assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Walter Holland one half of my Land lying
 on Vaughan's Creek to him his Hens and assigns for ever but not to have the benefit of it
 till he comes of age.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Holland one half of my Land lying on
 Vaughan's Creek to him his Hens and assigns forever but not to have the benefit of it till he comes of age.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Arter Holland when she comes of
 age or marryeth two negro girls one of them to be about twelve or fifteen years old
 and the other about seven or eight years old out of my Estate also a good Horse and
 saddle to her and her Hens and assigns for ever.

Saddle to her and her heirs and assigns for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Dick Holland my Tract of Land known by the name of McFoley tract lying on a pumattuck River and Rough Creek to him his heirs and assigns for ever but not to have the benefit of it till he comes of age.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Holland one Thousand Dollars in Lew of Land to him his heirs and assigns for ever but not to have the benefit of it till he comes of age

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Patsy Holland when she comes of age or marryeth two negro girls one of them to be about twelve or fifteen years old and the other about seven or eight year old out of my estate also a good horse and saddle to her and her heirs and assigns for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto the hands of my dearly beloved wife Martha Holland's three negroes Caddy, Fanny and Dinah and their increase to the discretion of my beloved wife Martha Holland to give to any of my children or to all of them as she shall think proper at her own discretion.

Item My will and desire is that if any of my children should die without a lawful heir of their body their part of my Estate shall be Equally divided betwixt all the rest of my children or their heirs lawfully begotten.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved brother Christopher T. Holland & my right to that part of the Land that Robert Venable laid off to him & his heirs the Land that he now lives on to him his heirs and assigns for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Christopher
Land to him his heirs and assigns for ever but not to have the benefit of it till he comes of age
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Patsy Holland when she comes of age or
marryeth two negro girls one of them to be about twelve or fifteen years old and the other
about seven or eight years old out of my estate also a good horse and saddle to her and her

Heirs and assigns for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my dearly beloved wife Martha Holland
three Negroes each, Fanny and Dinah and their increase to the discretion of my beloved
wife Martha Holland to give to any of my children or to all of them as she shall
think proper at her own discretion.

Item My will and desire is that if any of my children should die without a
lawful heir of their body their part of my Estate shall be Equally divided
between all the rest of my children or their Heirs lawfully begotten.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Brother Christopher H. Holland
all my right to that part of the Land that Robert Winable land of
himself being the Land that he now lives on to him his Heirs and assigns for ever

Item My will and desire is that the Bond I have on Mungah Woods shall not be paid

Item My will and desire is that my Executor shall lend unto my children
and they come of age or marry at their discretion out of my estate that I have

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Bequeathed any part that they shall think proper, and that my Children shall
be raised out of my Estate, and at the death of my dearly beloved wife Martha Holland
all the Estate they may have Lint my Children shall be bro't together and equally
divided among all my Children or their Heirs, Lastly I ordain this my last will and
Testament revoking all other wills by me made and do constitute this my last will and
Testament and I do appoint my dearly beloved wife Martha Holland Deet.
James Walker and Benjamin Moor Executors to this my last will and
Testament my will and desire is that my Estate shall not be appraised without my
hand and seal this ninth Day of April Eighteen Hundred and two

have bequeathed to any one of my other sons that the deficiency shall be made up to him
when he comes of age out of the Estate of the said John Holland

The court for Linn County April the 18th 1803. The last will and
testament of Dick Holland deceased was presented in Court and proved by the oaths of
Nicholas Davis John Lanson and John Hill three of the witnesses thereto and the
memorandum thereon introduced was proved by the oaths of John Hill and Nicholas
Davis two of the witnesses thereto, ordered that the said will and memorandum
be recorded on the motion of Martha Holland and James Walker two of the Executors
therein named who with John Daniel and Nicholas Davis their Sureties entered
into and acknowledged their Bond for that purpose in the penalty of thirty
Thousand dollars and conditioned as the Law directs and thereupon the said
Martha Holland and James Walker took the oath required by Law
certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form is granted them and
leave given the other Executors therein named to make Execution thereof at
another day. And at another court held for the said county June the 20th 1803
On the motion of Benjamin Moore executor named in the within will who
with Nicholas Davis and Razon Porter his securities entered into taking no
condition according to Law thereupon the said Benjamin Moore took the
oath required by Law certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
is granted him
