Rose Mann should survive me my will & desire is after her decease she to be buried in a decent Christian manner then all the Money Bonds or property should be equally divided among

my two sons James Mann & John Mann as first mentioned

have received their parts of my whole Estate which is the sum of Money left
them in this my last will

This last Will and Testament of Fairson Mann Deceased was presented
in Court and proved by the Oaths of the three witnesses thereto ^{that the same} Ordered to be
Recorded on the motion of James Robertson one of the Executors therein
named who gave bond and security according to law and took the Oaths
required by law Certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
is granted him and leave given the other Executors therein named to take
Execution thereof at another day And at another Court held for the
said County the 21st day of April 1866 This last Will and Testament of
Fairson Mann deceased was again presented in Court and on the motion
of Simon Woolbridge the other Executor therein named with
Peter Fox and John Franklin his Secretary entered into and acknowledged
therefor for the purpose in the Oaths of two thousand dollars
and conditioned according to law and took the Oaths required by law
Certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form is granted
him
