Will } being of sound mind & memory; do hereby make this my last Will and Testa-
in manner & form following (viz)

Impremis I hereby revoke all wills & Testaments, by me made prior to this date.

Item I lend to my beloved wife Molly Moore the tract of Land I purchased of
Thomas Moore & George Watton, containing five hundred acres, to be laid off by
and bounded as follows. Beginning at a corner Hickory near ^{old house and} Andersons place
thence along a line to Sarah Moors Corner. Thence along her line to George Smith
by a Spring; thence to another corner of said Smiths Land; thence along said
to a Corner at an Old field; thence to Henry Watkins Corner; thence along Henry
Line to a branch near his Mill thence up said branch to a corner between said Wat-
myself; thence a straight line to the Mouth of a dividing branch Called Evans Creek
up the Creek to Randalls old line & thence a straight line to the beginning. I likewise
to my said wife half my Tract of Land & half the profits of my Mill in Lumburg
purchased by me of Jacob Ferguson, Thomas Ellis & John Ellis during her natural life, &
her four Negroes (viz) Anthony, Old Sam, Little Sam Ruth & Andy. Also one third of
my Stock of every kind; household & Kitchen furniture during her life. Also my
Chair & harness. I give & bequeath to my aforesaid wife one hundred pounds in
Item I give & bequeath to my Grandson Lope Hamblitt this his heirs forever Five
acres of Land on the North side of the River

acres of land on the North side of the Road, beginning on Andersons line about one
yards North of the road, & thence a straight line to Doctor Masters, be the same
up, I also lend here two Negroes, Melly & Aggy during his life and after his death
the said Negroes & their increase to his daughter Nancy Hamlett & her heirs forever
I also give and bequeath to my said Grand son Jefe Hamlett the sum of one hundred
pounds to him & his heirs forever.

Item, I lend to my Grand daughter Martha Hamlett two Negroes Rachel & Little
during her life and after her death I give the said Negroes and their increase to her
Child Eliza Hamlett and her heirs forever, I also give my aforesaid Grand daughter
one feather bed & furniture to be in care of my Wife until she arrives at the age
one ye and.

Item. I desire my Executors herein after named to sell my Tract of Land which
I now live, to the best advantage, allowing a convenient Credit if they find it so
and divide the money arising from said Sale equally between my Grand sons George
Jefe Moore, Thomas Moore, John Moore & William Moore, the children of my son
Moore. Item. I give to my son Thomas Moore one hundred pounds.

Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Ferguson all my Land in the state of Kentucky
to her & her heirs forever.

Item. I lend to my daughter Frances Hamlett one Negro Man named Tony
for life or widowhood and after her death or marriage I give the said Negro

Item. I give to my son Thomas Moore one Negro Man named Little & his heirs forever.

Moore Hamlett should receive the said negro before her mother's death, and ^{the} consequence of her
marriage, he pay some attention to education of his two Sisters Peggy & Fanny & to his two brothers
Robert & John as a consideration. The said Negro Jerry to descend to her heirs forever.

Item, I give to my daughter Nancy Ferguson One hundred pounds.

Item, I lend to my son in Law John Watkins the other half of the tract of Land, & the other half
of the profits of my mill in the County of Lunenburg mentioned above until the death of my
Wife Molly Moore.

Item my will and desire is that the Remainder of my Estate not already mentioned, should
be equally divided between all my children except Elizabeth Malone and Francis Hamlett
and that Elizabeth Malones equal dividend be equally divided between her children, James
Daniel Cole & Polly Whitter Smith; to descend to them & their heirs forever, & that Francis Hamlett's
equal dividend be equally divided between her children Thomas Moore Hamlett, John Hamlett
Robert Hamlett, Peggy Hamlett & Fanny Hamlett & that the profits arising from the
dividend of the four last mentioned children be applied to their education by Thomas ^{Moore}
Hamlett to whom I leave it in charge.

Item my will is that all the lands left to my wife, & the mill and Land in Lunenburg
lent to her & my son in Law John Watkins and all the negroes, Stock & furniture at her death, be
equally divided among all my children except Elizabeth Malone & Francis Hamlett, and
the equal dividend of Elizabeth Malone, be equally divided between her children James Dan-
iel Cole & Polly Whitter Smith to them and their heirs forever, and that the equal dividend

of Francis Hamblitt be equally divided between her Children Thomas Moore Hamblitt
John Hamblitt, Robert Hamblitt, Peggy Hamblitt & Arny Hamblitt to them and
their heirs forever.

Item my will is that my Executors herein after named shall sell my mill before mentioned
when they shall think fit, if it should not be kept in good repair by the persons to

Lastly I hereby constitute, nominate and appoint my wife Molly Moore my Executrix & John Watkins & Deane Hamblett my whole & sole Executors to this my last will & Testament in Writings whereof I the said George Moore do hereunto set my hand & seal this fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety eight.

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A Court held for Prince Edward County December 27th 1798. This last Will and Testament of George Moore ~~was~~ was presented in Court and proved by the Oaths of Alexander Gault junior and Martha Evans two of the Witnesses thereto. Ordered that the same be recorded. On the Motion John Watkins, Jeph Hamletts and Molly Moore Executors and Executrix therein named who with Thomas Flannoy, James Coates, Charles Scott and R. C. Masters their Secretaries entered into and Acknowledged their bond for that purpose in the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars Conditioned as the law directs and took the Oath required by Law Certificate for obtaining a probat thereof in due form is granted them.
