memory, do constitute this my Last Will and Testament as
followeth, I do hereby direct my whole estate to be sold for
twelve months Credit except the Land and Tenement, I lately
purchased of Samuel Morton on Sanderson which I give to
my dear wife and Children, to be equally divided between
them and their heirs forever, including one Child unborn, also
all monies arising from the sales of the aforesaid Estate, after
paying my debts. I desire to be equally divided between the
aforesaid parties, which is my dear wife Susanah Clarke my
daughter Elizabeth Clarke, and the Child unborn, also I
do appoint, Richard Royall, Worsham Anderson Executors
and my dear wife Executrix to manage settle and collect all
monies due me and pay all debts &c or as many as to the
Amount of my estate in their hands, also I do direct the
Executors &c to sell all Lands I now own except the Land at give
to my Wife and heirs aforesaid, In Witn^{ess} whereof I do

hereunto set my hand and affix my Seal this seventeenth
day of March one thousand seven hundred and twenty two
