 and that all mankind are mortal, I do hereby make my last Will
 Testament hereby revoking all other Wills by me made. And
 first I do give my Soul to Almighty God that gave it in hope at the
 General Resurrection to receive it again with joy, and my Body to
 be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter
 named, and for my Worldly Estate, it hath pleased God to
 Endow me withall I dispose of in manner & form following Viz
 I give unto my Loving Wife Phoebe Owen my Portion
 on Sandy River in Prince Edward County together with the land as
 far west to wit, Beginning at James Hamletts Line on the River
 thence down the River each side to a marked Line, thence along the
 said Line to the Back line, thence along the Back line to James
 Hamletts Line. I give together with my Negro Man named Saladin
 also my Negro Woman named Fred, also two Feather Beds and furniture
 on said Table two Chests two Chairs and two Stools.

one Coat Table, two Chests, ^{two} Chair in Parlor, ^{two} Seats, four pew
Sticks, two Barons, one from Port one Tying Pan, four Bowls
four Carling, the Cues not to exceed four years old Mrs. Thomas also all
my stock of Haggis one Dozen Table Knives and Forks one Marrow
by one Bunch the two Baron Dais also all my Gun and
Tools of all kinds, also one Marrow Saddle one Coat Horse
Hacking Saddle and one Hunt Saddle, two Wools and one Flax
Wool from the Cotton Parlor also all the Cotton of Wool Cards & Wool
to her my said Wife, I wish to and passing the Term of her natural
Life and after her decease all the Marrow Estate to be Equally
Divided among all my my Children Except the following I reserve of
the Marrow Marrow, but if any of my young Daughters Mary Ellen
get an other focus, also after my Wife's Decease, I give by bequest
and my Daughter Mary Ellen the Land of Plantation first
abandonment Mary Wife of my Daughter Mary should have
Quarter benefit on one third of my said Land except the

the Plantation. Upon my Wife's Demands, my Will & Desire is that she
shall have them.

Item I give unto my Daughter Mary one Negro Man named Sam also one
Feather bed and furniture, one Cow & calf & one young steer & one horse
I will to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Lydia Owen one Tract or parcel of Land
lying on Sandy River and is bounded by the following lines (to wit) ^{to wit}
From Clarke's line & up the River to a dividing line between Jarrima
Owen, thence along her line to a back line, thence along the said
line to Clarke's line, also I give unto my said Daughter one
Negro Girl named Milla also one Feather Bed & furniture also
one Cow & calf & one Heffer, to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Jarrima Owen one Tract of Land it
is bounded by the following lines (to wit) Beginning at my
Daughter Lydia's line on Sandy River, thence up the said River
to my Daughter Mary's line, thence along her line to the back
line, thence along the said line to my Daughter Lydia's line & also
give and bequeath unto my said Daughter one Negro Woman

then I give unto my daughter a pair of silver plates
given and bequeth unto my said Daughter one Negro Woman
named Sarah also one feather Bed and furniture also one Cow
and Calf and one young steer, to her and her heirs forever

Then I give unto my daughter Kepeat Queen a Tract of Land
lying in Crows Lake County on the Branch of Sandy River
containing two hundred and forty three acres and is bounded by the following
lines to wit, To Clarko John Ligon Harry Duhon & John Clarko

then I give unto my said Daughter one Negro boy named
Landon also one feather Bed and furniture one Cow Calf
and one dog to her and to her heirs forever

Then I give unto my Daughter Lucy Watson one Negro Woman
named Bet to her and to her heirs forever

Then I give unto my Daughter Lou John Watson, Farmer Brackett &
John Watson one Negro Woman named Sally Davidson
and one young steer to her and to her heirs forever

I have now along this man an expert of all the last and the best of

Lastly I do constitute and appoint my will be done Wife John Owen
my son Brackett Owen my friend James Hamblet, President
