Will and Testament in Manner and form following.
First I Give my Soul to God who gave it, and my Body to be Buried in
Earth in hopes of a glorious Resurrection, as to my worldly goods I Dis-
pose of them as followeth, first I will that all my Just Debts be Paid
by my Executors hereafter named. And I Give and bequeath to my
Dear Brother James Read all my Lands to him and his Heirs. also
I Give to my Brother James Read my Drury coat & Brown Jacket
and I Give to my Brother Samuel Read, my Scarlet Jacket, and I Give
to my Brother Robert Read my white coat. and I Give to my Dear
Father my Black Jacket, and my two Wares, and I Give my Saddle
to my Brother Robert. I nominate constitute and Appoint my Dear
Father James Read, and my Brother James Read, to be my Executors
of this my Last Will and I hereby revoke Renounce & Disannul
all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this 1st of Nov 20 1790

to my my Black Jacket, and my two Marcs, and I give my Saddle
to my Brother Robert. I nominate constitute and appoint my Dear
Father James Reed, and my Brother James Reed, to be my Executors
of this my Last Will and I hereby over and renounce & disannul
all former Wills by me made. I Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this first Day of June 1763
