

In the name of God amen, I John Thompson of the County of Prince Edward being in
perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following,

I give and bequeath unto my two sons Robert and Roger Thompson all the lands in the tract in which
I live, to be equally divided between them, they having regard to quantity and ^{quality} in such division to them and their
heirs for ever, each of my said two sons Robert and Roger for this consideration to pay my son John Thompson
Fifteen pounds Virginia currency within three years from the day of my death, and each of my two sons
Robert and Roger to pay my Daughter Sarah Five pounds and also to pay my Daughter Mary five pounds each
also within three years from the day of death.

I give and bequeath unto my son Robert one mare called Dury, two cows and all my hogs, and all the
corn made the year of my death.

I give and bequeath unto my son Roger one mare called Nancy.

I direct that the rest of my estate not herein given away be equally divided between my sons Robert and
Roger. I also give unto my said two sons Robert and Roger all my furniture and tools of every kind to be equally divided between my said two sons Robert &
Roger except my bed and furniture in which I sleep, which said bed and furniture I give to my grand daughter
Sarah Parker, all the rest and residue of my Estate of what nature or kind soever, I direct to be equally
divided between my said two sons Robert and Roger, and all the Estate herein given to my Christian African
School I give to them as officers and their heirs forever, and do appoint my ^{said} two sons Robert and Roger Executors
of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills by me before made, declaring this
and none other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this twenty eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three (1793)

Wishes that my son and his wife should be as happy as I am, and as I have no other children, I give to them as executors and their heirs forever, and as executor my two sons Robert and Roger Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills by me before made, declaring this and none other to be my last Will and Testament. In Wills whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eighth day of March in the year of Christ one thousand seven hundred and seventy five (79⁵).

At a Court held for Prince Edward County June 15th 1795 —

This last Will and Testament of John Thompson deceased was presented in Court and proved by the Oaths of Francis Matthews and Samuel W.
