equally divided between my forementioned Brother Gedaliah and Sister
Molly and I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Father Leander
Hughes and Brother Gedaliah Hughes as Ex^{rs} of this my last will and
Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this thir-
teenth day of February anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and
Twenty two
