my first Children David my two Son-in-law Robert & Caleb Baker
his daughter but the Wife of Samuel Johnston Martha the
Wife of Charles Living and Mary the Wife of Robert Living
to them and their heirs forever. My Will is that no share not
selling with my Executor Samuel Johnston that if his Legacy
of Twenty pounds left him by my Husband Calib Baker
be not paid him by the time he comes to the age of twenty
years he be paid out of the Bond of my Executors household
Debt he not repaid my Will is that if there is a balance
due to him by the time he comes to the age of twenty years
