Assigns forever being part of the Estate last and by my Husband aforesaid
Hem. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Julie Gunn one Feather
Bed and furniture one Cow and calf and a flax Hatchell to her and to her
Heirs and Assigns forever of the same Estate.
Hem. I give and bequeath to my son John Booker one Feather Bed and furniture
one yoke of oxen, one Cow and calf & a Hesper one writing desk, (which he has in
possession.) One black walnut Cupboard, two folding walnut Tables, all my stock of
Cuse and my plantation utensills to him his Heirs & Assigns forever of the same Estate.
Hem. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebekah Smith one bed & furniture, one
Cow and calf and a writing Desk to her and her Heirs and Assigns forever of the same Estate.
Hem. I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Florence Booker one
Hunting saddle to her and her Heirs and Assigns forever of the same Estate.
Hem. I give and bequeath to my son John Booker and my Daughter Rebekah
Smith one Negro man Peter to be divided equally between them at their discretion
to them their Heirs and Assigns forever of the same Estate.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son John Booker and my Daughter
Smith one Negro man Peter. to be divided equally between them at their discretion

Item. I further desire that after all my Just debts are paid amongst which is one
due my son William Flournoy Booker of Seventeen pounds for a debt he paid to my
Brother Thomas Flournoy which I conceive to be Justly due him from my
Husband aforesaid, that the whole of my Estate as well that lent me by my
Husband not heretofore mentioned. Consisting of Slaves stock of all kind, and
Household & Kitchen Furniture not already given away. be divided at the
discretion of my Exors amongst my Children (to wit) the one Seventh to Gideon
Booker. Jane Davis Morton, William Flournoy Booker, Elizabeth Julie Green,
Rebekah Smith and my son John Booker two Sevenths, to them their Heirs and
Assigns forever, but it is my desire that should my son Gideon Booker die without
an Heir, that his part may go to my Daughter Mary Williams Booker, also
I desire that my slaves, may not be sold out of my family. I do hereby constitute

I give and devise to my Daughter Elizabeth Wilson three Negroes Melly, Leacey & Henry and their Increase. I give and devise to my son Nathaniel Hudson three Negroes Rachel, Plaster and their Increase Hugg. I give and devise to my son John Hudson all the land in the Tract whereon I now live and three Negroes Jane, Anne & their Increase and Sam. All the rest of my Negroes and the Stock of all kinds household and Kitchen.
