I Give to my daughter Mary and my son Francis the Land and
Plantations which I own together with the following Negroes
to wit Dick commonly called Gardens Dick Big Ned, Black Dick
Little Ned and a Negro Girl named Betty as also the Stock of every
kind to wit horses, Cattle, Sheep & Hogs &c; with all the Grain and other
kind of Crop on the Estate as my desired allowing seeing carriage and
clothing except the said beds & the rest of the
household furniture which I give to each of my children William
Nathaniel and Elizabeth Nelson.

I gave to my Daughter Mary, A valuable one negro man named Saml
also I gave to my said daughter Mary, the Gift of a new already made Lin
en Negro woman named Lucy and her children to her and
her Husband, it is also my Will that the sum of One hundred & fifty
pounds be paid to my said daughter Mary out of my Estate which was
promised her by her deceased brother Nathaniel;

I give to my daughter Mary and my son Francis, the Landrairie
Plantations which I own here together with the following Negroes
to wit: Dick commonly called Gardens Dick, Leg Ann, Hattie Dick
Little Ann and a Negro Girl named Betty as also the Stock of every
kind to wit: Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs &c. with all the Grain and other
kind of Crop on the Estate as my dearest also my riding carriage and
clothing, rings except two sent for by the Harrold
family's provision which I give to each of my children William
Thomas and Elizabeth Holman.

400. I give to my daughter Mary Anne my son Richard A. Venable ^{each} One hundred pounds ~~of~~ ⁱⁿ money.

It is to be understood that the several sums herein mentioned as given to my children in money are to be paid out of my part of the debts due to the Store in which I am concerned:—

I give to my son William Venable my one fourth part of the Union Mills, with my interest in the Negroes and every other species of property belonging to the said Mills except the profits which may be made to the time of my decease also one Negro man called William Dick.

I give to my sons William and Thomas all the rest of my estate which has not before given in this Will to them and their heirs forever:—

All my eldest sons, Samuel A. Venable & Abraham Venable have already received their respective shares of my estate:—

I Appoint my son Richard Venable Executor of this my Will and I solemnly request that he will see that the same is duly executed.
