for any worldly estate that it hath please god to provide me with all I desire of in the answer and
have following Wills.

I give and bequeath unto my sister Sarah Humble my Negro manch Owe to her and to her heirs forever
and also my bed and furniture, and also my riding saddle.

I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Owe Humble the debt of Seven pounds that
Crajanus Barstow owes me.

I give and bequeath unto my Nephew William Sumner five pounds two shillings and 6 pence that Owe South
Owe me.

My Will further is that the debts that I owe out and the expenses of Decently burying me agreeable
to my Will above be paid out of the money that I have given to my sister Elizabeth and my Nephew
the Sumner proportionately to their Value Signed with my own hand and sealed with my own seal
this twentieth day of September one thousand seven hundred and seventy four.
