I then give and bequeath unto my son John Gillespie one hundred
and fifty acres of Land whercon I now live to him and his Heirs
forever
I then give and bequeath unto my son David Gillespie one hundred
and fifty acres of Land at the upper end of my land to him and his Heirs
forever I also give to my son David Gillespie a horse and the upper part of my my old still
I then give and bequeath unto my son John Gillespie one hundred

all my move and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Isabella Gillespie
even head of great cattle a haire mare & the third part of my sheep
in her place. Down forever I also send my wife my stile during her
widowhood for the benefit of my family.
I then give and bequeath unto my son Wm Gillespie one hundred
and fifty acres of land whereon I now live to him and his heirs
forever I also give to my son William two steers & a chest and my Bible
forever

I then give and bequeath unto my son David Gillespie one hundred
and fifty acres of land at the upper end of my land to him & his heirs
forever I also give to my son David Gillespie a horse and the upper part of my my old stile
I then give and bequeath unto my son George Gillespie one hundred
and twenty four acres of land with my mill to him and his heirs
forever I also give to my son George Gillespie a horse and the upper part of my my old stile
I then give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret one
cow at her mothers death

bed and furniture two colts two cows six sheep two sows &
