In the name of God Amen I Robert Taylor of Prince Edward County being
weak in body, but of sound mind and memory do make my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
all the Wills heretofore made by me, and first giving up my soul to God that gave it me
and my body to be decently buried, and as to what ever worldly goods I have pleased the
almighty to endow me with, I dispose of in manner and form following, —
I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Maude Taylor, now Taylor last and once Bolton with her
husband she to have her choice, to her my said daughter and her heirs forever —
I Give and bequeath unto my son Moses Taylor the sum of six pounds current money of Virginia to be
paid to him when ever he comes of age or shall marry to have my said son and to his heirs forever —
I Give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Susan Taylor daughter of my son William
Taylor the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to be paid to her my said Grand daughter
when ever she shall be a widow of my whole Estate to her my said Grand daughter and to
her heirs forever —

I Surrogate Maude unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Taylor for and during the term of —

his natural life a Widower my plantation with all my land, and also all the rest of my Estate, and household goods away. But if my said Wife Elizabeth Torrey should survive then my will and desire is that my whole Estate should be sold of and sold equally divided between my said Wife and all my children first, Ezekiel Torrey, Isaac Torrey, Robert Torrey, Benjamin Torrey, John Torrey and to my Daughter Mauden Torrey, and Mary Torrey to them my said children and their heirs forever. My will and desire is that if my said Wife Elizabeth Torrey should survive and take her equal part with all my children, then at her death, that her part return back and be equally divided between all my children.

Lastly My Will and desire is that my son Ezekiel Torrey and my beloved brother David Holt be executors to this my last Will and Testament this fourth day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety six.

This last Will and Testament of Robert Torrey deceased was presented in court and proved by the oaths of Jacob Welch and Anna Welch two of the Witnesses thereto, ordered that the same be recorded; on the motion of Ezekiel Torrey and David Holt executors therein named, who with John Smith and Jacob Welch then present entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one thousand pounds conditioned as the law directs, and took the oath required by law certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form is granted them.
