freely and voluntarily do hereby bequeath and devise all my estate and possessions
I have I give to my son John Atkins and a Negro woman named Hannah and her husband
all my Negroes they named Dick and my father Richard & Hugo & Blanket & Butler & them
I give to my son Joseph Atkins my Land and Plantation whereon I now live also one
Negro man named Peter and one Negro Girl named Sarah and a white boy named
Samuel and one cow & two young cattle & what at buffer and well I also give
to my son Joseph Atkins my two old Negroes to wit Dick and Feller the remainder
part of my stock of cattle sheep and Hogs one barrel mace & all about my
House hold Furniture mentioned in my will also all tools of every kind on his
Payment to his Sister Mary Kullidge the sum of twenty six pounds five shillings
I then I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Brown one Negro man named Bradford
and here I then I give to my Daughter Sarah Atkins one Negro Girl named
Delaney and one father bed & furniture and if she should die without a lawfull
Heir Begotten of her Body her Part shall return to be Equally Divided between
Joseph Atkins and Mary Kullidge I also give to my Daughter Sarah one
Coat of Mail I then I give to my Daughter Mary Kullidge one Man named
Tom to her and her heirs I then I give to my grand Daughter Frances Davison
one Negro Boy named Gilbert to her and her heirs if she should die without
an Heir Lawfully Begotten of her Body he shall return to be Equally Divided
between all my Children I then I give to my grand Daughter Ann Kullidge
five shillings Sterling I Robert Atkins do constitute and appoint my son
Joseph Atkins my friend Marmaduke Dejeanett my friend John Dejeanett
Executors of this my Last will and Testament as Witness my Hand and Seal
This 7th day of March 1777

 an Heir Lawfully Begotten of her Body he shall return to be Equally Divided
 between all my Children Item I give to my grand Daughter Ann Rutledge
 one Shillings Sterling I Robert Atkins do constitute and appoint my son
 Joseph Atkins my friend Mumford Deparment my friend John Deparment
 Executors of this my Last will and Testament as Wits of my Hand and Seal
 this 7th day of March - 1777
